<p>1. Elective courses – Dubai-London EMBA students have access to the elective courses at London Business School. You can select a format and timeframe to suit you. Core courses have been carefully planned so you can begin taking electives as early as the end of the third term.</p> <p>2. Management Reports – These courses give you the opportunity to work – individually and in a team – with a faculty member on two projects that challenges you to analyse and resolve complex business problems using the business skills, frameworks and tools acquired through the programme.</p> <p>3. Optional International assignment – London Business School offers a range of international assignment destinations, which allow you to further broaden your global perspective and test and apply new skills in a different business environment. Each trip has its own unique focus, but usually includes corporate and government visits tied into real-time consultancy projects. Locations can include eastern Europe, China, South Africa and India.</p>

Capstone - This course enables you to draw together your learning from the entire Executive MBA programme to prepare you for the transitions ahead. You will distil the most important aspects of your time at the School, and explore three critical themes that will keep you on your chosen track as alumni.
